BACKGROUND: The PWU is calling on the Ontario government to rethink its plan to close coal-fuelled electricity generation plants in Ontario. PWU maintains it would be more in the best interest of Ontario citizens to retain coal in the energy mix by continuing to install cleaner technology at existing plants. Over the past 20 years, this retrofitting has already achieved significant emission reductions.
